**Re: EBR Registry Number: 013-3330**

The Lake Panache Campers Association Inc. reviewed the Instrument Proposal Notice posted on the Environmental Registry regarding the activities Mr. Gordon Salo wishes to undertake on his claims in the Lake Panache area.

Our members are very concerned about the possible environmental impacts of these activities on the water quality of Lake Panache as well as possible excessive noise related to activities, the potential for increased vehicular traffic on Northshore Road, and the potential for forest fire activity due to the hot, dry conditions. Our members previously expressed concerns about the noise emanating from activities on some of these sites, possible impacts on the fish and wildlife habitats in the area and possible negative impacts on Killarney Provincial Park which borders Lake Panache.

Ideally, our members prefer no mining-related activities are permitted on this location, or any other location on the shores of Lake Panache, to ensure the full protection of the lake and its resources. In the absence of a prohibition on such activities, we trust the Ministry of Northern Development and Mines, working with other related ministries and the City of Greater Sudbury, will ensure:

- 1) Any mining-related activities undertaken on these claims are conducted with the proper permits, with appropriate consultation on the issuance of such permits;



- 2) All necessary precautions are taken to protect the water quality on Lake Panache and protect fish and wildlife habitats in the area, in consultation with experts at the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks and Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry;
- 3) Appropriate restrictions are in place to mitigate any noise concerns to local residents and campers, developed in consultation with local homeowners and campers; and
- 4) Appropriate steps are taken to ensure the safety of vehicles travelling on Northshore Road, developed in consultation with the City of Greater Sudbury and local residents.

This correspondence is being shared with our members and Councillor Michael Vagnini, Ward 5, City of Greater Sudbury.
