
**FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT — BY Peter Palko**

Summer often brings with it hot, dry weather which can elevate the need for Fire Safety and Fire Prevention. The Campers Association owns a portable gasoline engine fire pump which is stored at The Penage Bay Marina in a small unlocked shed next to the launch ramp.

In the shed you will find the pump, suction line, nozzle, and fire hose. The pump runs on regular fuel (no oil required) and is self priming. If you need to use the pump to extinguish a fire please return it, and all its components as soon as possible as others may also require its use.

We will do our best to ensure the pump is ready to use in these situations, however if you experience any problems with it please let someone on the executive know so that it can be maintained. Although the fire pump is at the marina, remember that fire can travel much faster than you can. To reduce the catastrophic damage caused by a fire, the faster you respond to it, the more control you will have. I strongly recommend that you purchase your own fire pump, or approach neighbours in your area and cost share the purchase of a fire pump so that your response time is shortened.

Enjoy your treasured time on Lake Panache and be fire conscious, and safe.

## WATER QUALITY REPORT — BY Al Walker

Water quality is still one of the hottest topics of conversation when out enjoying a weekend at the lake. Most of our activities at camp revolve around the water and I am sure we all take pride and care in maintaining the quality of the water.

At the 2001 Annual General Meeting, the membership of the association asked to begin taking water samples so the association could measure the quality of the water.

Samples taken are tested for total coli form and e-coli. This past summer there were two sets of samples taken from around the lake, one set on July 6 and the other on August 28. The test results were all good and the numbers better than past years. This coming summer we are looking at getting 3 full set of samples, which would be approximately 30 in total.

Just remember that water from any source should never be consumed unless it has been treated first!

Jennifer Salo, Source Water Protection Communications Specialist for the Nickel District Conservation Authority, has been busy working with Lake Stewardship Groups and forwarding information on maintaining good water quality throughout the region.

The focus right now is on water source protection. New legislation, called the “Clean Water Act”, had its first reading this past December. The Act is designed to protect existing and future sources of drinking water. This is my first report since assuming the role as President in April of last year. I want to thank the other Directors for all their help and leadership that have made my duties flow smoothly.

It has been one year since Brian and Christina Young left for South East Asia. I gained a lot of knowledge from Brian while working with him in the Association and would like to thank him for his many, many years of hard work. We look forward to his return in the near future.

The Annual General Meeting was held in November 2005 at the Tom Davies Community Centre in Lively. Along with the regular business, we were honoured to have two terrific and knowledgeable speakers.

The first speaker was Ron Luopa, Operations Forester, with Vermillion Forest Management. Ron spoke about their role in managing the Vermillion Forest area including preparing a forest management plan for MNR every five years, forest regeneration and compliance monitoring of logging operations. Ron explained the two main types of harvesting: clear cutting and the shelter wood system. At the end of the presentation there were several questions asked with many focused on harvesting at Brady Lake.

The second speaker was Leo Frappier, Fireman with the Public Service Division, of the Sudbury Fire Services. Leo had a very informative presentation on camp and home fire prevention. He emphasized the importance of escape plans, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and CO detector maintenance. There were many questions fielded after his presentation.



I would like to thank Verna Gutsch, Shelley Palko and Rick Sleaver for letting their names stand for another term of office.

The key revenue source for the Association is the sale of memberships. It is very important that we maintain a healthy level so we can offset our expenses. The number of memberships has declined slightly over the past few years and Susan Plante will be reporting on these numbers in her report. If you know of any new campers or those that have let their membership lap please ask them to buy a membership.

The Spring Thaw Dance is taking place on April 1, 2006, which is three weeks earlier than last year. Last year's dance was a huge success and thank you to Verna for heading it up. Please come out and join the fun.

We were disappointed with the low turn out for the Kid's Fishing Day. Shelley Palko put in a lot of time and effort planning the event. Thanks for your hard work Shelley.

The picnic was reinstated this past summer and the weather truly co-operated. Thanks to all of the hard work Susan Plante invested, not only was the picnic a huge success, all expenses were covered by picnic revenues and donations. Thanks Susan and all those that helped her out. It is truly a great way to bring the members and friends together for an afternoon of food, games, and fun.

Each year the Association must deal with ongoing expenses. These expenses range from Officers and general liability insurance, upkeep and repairs to the Heli-pad, dock, boat ramp and retaining walls, as well as the marker lights on the lake.

Once again, it was difficult to acquire insurance and very expensive to maintain. Insurance is the largest expense to the Association running at about \$4,000.

We had repair work performed on the access road to the Heli-pad, asphalt patching on the hill and further repairs to the retaining wall at the boat ramp. Thanks to George Tompkins for making sure that this area is well maintained. This was a cost of approximately \$2000. We applied to the MNR for assistance with this outlay but they did not have any money in their budget but they have assisted in the past.

Thanks to Peter Palko, Paul Young, Pat Niro and many others for taking care of the marker lights on the lake. The maintenance and replacement of these lights run at about \$1000 per year. A special thanks to Bill Cook for his detailed bookkeeping and maintaining a balanced budget.

Last but not least, I would like to thank the mysterious and aloof director, Rick Sleaver, who generally joins our monthly meeting by phone from his home in Toronto. Rick does great work for us as secretary for the association. He created and updates our website, gets our bulletin organized and out for print, and is our communication expert. There may be one or two directors that are not sure if he truly exists.

In closing, I would like to thank all the members that participate in the activities and events that take place within the association. I invite the membership to get involved. If you see something wrong report it, protect the environment, and be safe.
