

# MEMBERSHIP REPORT BY STEPHEN MCMURRAY

### FIRE REPORT BY STUART GREAVES

2015 was a quiet year for fires around Lake Panache, thankfully!

Only 2 fires reported - one in Saginaw Channel that was handled by the Ministry of Natural Resources and one at Snake Channel that was handled by the camp owner.

The Lake Panache Campers has 10 Fire Pump Kits located around the lake. These kits contain a fire pump (runs on regular gas, no oil required), 200' hose, a spray nozzle and suction line along with operating instructions. Please see the location coordinates on next page or visit our website for a map of the fire pump locations. The kits are for all to use in the event of a fire.

It's very important to let any of the directors know if you have used one of the kits and to return them the way you found them. We had an incident in 2015 where a pump was used and returned with a broken starter cord and no one was made aware of this until late fall. Please keep us informed so these valuable resources can be repaired if damaged and available when needed.

Escaping for some summer fun requires the same amount of fire safety due diligence that you use at home. Before you can truly relax and enjoy the great outdoors, you need to know your family is Fire Smart. That means working smoke alarms on every camp level and outside sleeping areas, make sure the batteries are fresh and alarms are less than 10 years old.

Make sure your camp is equipped with CO detectors if you have a fireplace, woodstove, gas heater or any gas or propane appliances. Should a fire break out in your camp or surrounding area, please ensure your family has an escape plan and assembly area! Also ensure you have your camp GPS coordinates available should you have to call in a fire emergency!

Another great investment to your camp tool kit is your very own fire pump, hose and nozzle or consider sharing a system with your camp neighbours!

Enjoy your treasured time on Lake Panache and please be Fire Conscious and Fire Smart!

### LIGHT REPORT BY PAUL YOUNG

The Lake Panache Camper's Association installs and maintains flashing amber marker lights in various locations around the lake to designate shoals and other hazards. These lights are located primarily in high traffic areas and are installed by volunteers who donate their time and resources.

Several years ago, the lights were all converted from conventional battery operated lights to solar powered LED lights to improve reliability and decrease the maintenance required to keep them operational. This allowed many lights to be left out year round. It also put an end to the purchase and subsequent disposal of approximately 120 batteries twice a year which over the eight year life of the lights would have been an astonishing 1,900 batteries!

In 2016, we are replacing all of our lights again. They had a five year life expectancy and most have made it at least eight. However, with the failure rate we were seeing in the fall, we decided to replace them all. This will be an expensive and time consuming venture, but one which we intend to take on without any extra fundraising efforts. At this time, we have sufficient funds to replace all of our lights without having to launch another "buy a light" campaign. As technology has improved, the replacement lights we are purchasing have a greater range and a projected 15 year life expectancy for approximately the same cost as 8 years ago.

While we are currently enjoying the snowmobile and ice fishing season on the lake (finally), we are also gearing up so we are ready to go in the spring for the start of boating season. As usual, we try to have the lights installed and operational for the May long weekend and remain up until after Thanksgiving, as long as the weather co-operates.

We remind you these marker lights are only installed to identify hazards. They are not approved by Transport Canada fand are not intended or navigational purposes.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT BY STUART GREAVES

Greetings Lake Panache campers! The 2016 camp season is well on its way and it's time to get you up to speed on the happenings around the lake. The high water levels in the fall of 2015 and late start to winter has certainly been different for 2016 - how many of you considered spending Christmas boating to camp? The warm weather, rain and lack of snow early in the season is causing issues with the ice conditions on the lake. Please be careful as on the ice as you are on the open water - safety first, safety always!

I'm sure most of you have experienced the improved cellular coverage around the lake, due in part to the installation of the Bell Tower on Ojibway Road. Thank you Bell Canada! Rogers had initially indicated they were also erecting a tower in 2015, however after many unanswered letters from your Association, we have yet to hear if this will happen in 2016.

After the installation of Solar Lights on the reflective cones at the Air Ambulance Helipad, we were advised by Ornge the site was certified for night operation. In the fall of 2015, we were advised by Ornge that recent changes to Ornge's helipad site design requirements resulted in the removal of our night landing certification. LPCA received the latest site design regulations and we will evaluate our site in the spring of 2016 to see if we can meet these specifications and be re-certified. As a result, at this time, there are no night landings our at helipad.

The Lake Panache Waste Transfer Depot on North Shore Road continues to be a topic of conversation and concern. I'm sure most of you have seen the huge mess in and around the bins throughout the camp season. Seems some individuals continue to leave inappropriate waste at the site. Please observe the signs at the site that indicate what can and cannot be deposited in the bins. The City of Greater Sudbury installed a monitoring booth at the site and will be implementing the number of days and hours the depot will be available for your waste disposal in 2016. We are told that anyone who pays city taxes around the lake will be notified of these changes.

#### LPCA To Do List for 2016:

- Continued repairs to the public dock and Ambulance Road maintenance
- Collect history about Lake Panache and publish on the LPCA website
- Continued Lake Stewardship initiatives to keep our lake pristine
- New marker lights to be installed in 2016

Our Annual General Meeting was held on Tuesday November 24, 2015, at Tom Davies Community Centre in Lively. Guest speaker was Debbie Trahan-Pero with a very eye opening presentation on Waste Reduction at camp. It's amazing how you can reduce your waste and what can be recycled at camp and home when you really think about it. At each Annual General Meeting, elections are held for positions on the Board of Directors for a three year term. Two of our directors, Rick Sleaver and Brian Young, stood for re-election in 2015 and we are very happy they both accepted to come back for another term. If you want to know what your LPCA is doing ,please come out to the next AGM to be held Tuesday, November 22, 2016 at 7:00 P.M. at the Tom Davies Community Centre.

Paul & Nigelle Fredette and Tim Walker head up our Lake Stewardship Committee and they have done a fantastic job setting up an extensive water sampling and monitoring program. Tim's expertise in computers and recording produced some great Lake Stewardship videos that are available on our <u>website</u> - please take time to have a look! Please feel free to contact any of the directors with any questions, concerns or ideas you may have that would enhance our water quality initiatives.

Your Lake Stewardship Committee held our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Hazardous Waste Day at the public dock Saturday, July 11, 2015 and another trailer load of waste was taken away from our lake to the City's hazardous waste depot. Our **2016 Hazardous Waste Day is Saturday, July 9, 2016**. 8:00 A.M. to Noon. Mark your calendar.

Another successful Spring Thaw Dinner Dance was held Saturday, April 18, 2015 with 180 in attendance. The 6:00 P.M. social started with live entertainment from the "Chicks with Picks" followed by a Caruso Club dinner at 7:00 P.M. Dancing and prizes followed with Red's DJ. A big thank you to all of our sponsors for your continued support (see list on page 7) and of course your LPCA Directors who put this all together! Awesome job! The Spring Thaw Dance will not be held in 2016; plan to attend in 2017!

Every year, we look to bolster our membership in the Association and are encouraging all campers to join. All funds collected from memberships are used to cover the Association's expenses for liability insurance, maintenance of Air Ambulance Road, the Helipad, the public boat launch, dock and signage. Your association also maintains marker lights around the lake and organizes our annual Family Day Picnic. We look forward to having you as a member!

# LAKE PANACHE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE BY TIM WALKER

The Lake Panache Stewardship Committee has a mandate to renew and consolidate our efforts as cottagers, advocates and stewards of our lake by:

- Providing information and education
- Monitoring water quality
- · Forming partnerships with all stakeholders

The members of the Board of Directors and Stewardship Committee worked towards these goals this year in the following ways:

- I) Members of the LPCA Stewardship Committee regularly attended meetings of the Greater Sudbury Watershed Alliance (GSWA). The Greater Sudbury Watershed Alliance is an independent grassroots, collaborative partnership of the lake, river and creek stewardship committees working together to promote and advocate for a healthy watershed. In June of 2015, GSWA, in conjunction with area stewardships, held a media event at the Ramsey Lake public boat launch to highlight the issue of invasive species within the area. A boat washing station was set-up to demonstrate the importance of cleaning your boat when moving it from one waterbody to another.
  - An additional media event is planned at Lake Panache in June of 2016 (June 23rd is the tentative date as of publishing). This event will also have a boat wash station set up at the Public Dock. Signage is currently being created to alert boaters about the risk of invasive species. This signage is being funded by the City of Greater Sudbury, GSWA and the individual lake stewardships. Campers are encouraged to attend and show their support for this important initiative.
- 2) On July 11, 2015, the third annual household hazardous waste (HHW) event was held at the Public Dock. Campers were encouraged to bring waste products where LPCA members collected them and transported them to the city depot where they could be appropriately disposed of. HHW includes products such as paint, batteries, motor oil antifreeze and other items that can not be disposed of in the garbage. Last year we managed to fill a large trailer and redirect these items from the landfill. Please mark Saturday, July 9, 2016 on your calendar for the 4th annual event. We hope to see you there.

In the meantime, please ensure your hazardous waste is appropriately disposed of. Residents of the City of Greater Sudbury can call the Toxic Taxi (705-560-9019) to come to their property and pick up Hazardous Wastes or they can also drop off their waste at the depot on Frobisher Street on selected dates. # LAKE STEWARDSHIP CONTINUED

This stewardship committee conducted water sampling in Lake Panache in the summer of 2015. Metal and Phosphorus levels were measured at 12 sampling sites that cover a large portion of the lake. The results of this sampling were reported at the Annual General Meeting in November 2015. Metal and phosphorus levels were found to be well within the guidelines set out by the province and consistent with the findings of the City of Greater Sudbury. The Stewardship Committee is continuing to monitor these water quality indicators over the coming years. Phosphorus is measured annually and metals testing occurs every five years.



# Household Hazardous Waste Depot

1853 Frobisher Street, Sudbury

Don't throw hazardous waste in the garbage, down the sink or in the sewer. Bring it to the Household Hazardous Waste Depot for free disposal.

### **Examples of materials accepted**

#### Common examples of household hazardous waste include:

medicines car wax

motor oil

- household batteries
- diesel
- antifreeze
- paints
- thinners
- rust removers
- fire extinguishers - fluorescent tubes
- ammonia - pool chemicals
- thermometers
- butane lighters and cylinders
  - kerosene
  - windshield washer
  - stains and preservatives
  - aerosols
  - propane tanks and cylinders
  - weed and bug killers
- transmission fluid
- brake fluid car batteries - gasoline
- alues
  - cements
- turpentine
- paint strippers
- drain openers fertilizers
- oven cleaners - syringes

### Materials not accepted:

No commercial, industrial, institutional, pathological, PCB, explosive, radioactive or unknown waste will be accepted.

### Please note:

- All waste must be clearly labelled and in sealed containers.
- Reusable containers will not be returned (i.e. plastic gas cans).
- Do not mix different products together.
- Syringes must be in a puncture-proof container.
